Viper Black is committed to authentic design and sustainable production. Initially inspired by a series of found family sketchbooks, Viper Black re-imagines hand drawn sketches with elements of graffiti and modern design. All shirts are made with 100% organic cotton, low-impact dyes and the conscious consumer in mind.

Viper Black was started in Los Angeles in 2007, by an independent, two-man team. Their backgrounds, and long love for t-shirts, make them a perfect fit for an environmentally sound clothing company with unique design.

Jedrek Speer (a.k.a. SEIZER-ONE) is a well-respected street art/ graffiti artist whose work can be spotted worldwide. Collectors of his art include underground gallery owners such as Jensen Karp (Gallery 1988) and Daniel Farias (Alpha Cult). Each piece of artwork used on the shirts tells a story from Speer's world. Many pieces are inspired from artwork found in his father's sketchbooks and others are significant to his daily life.

Jedrek's cousin, Russell Vare, comes from the field of renewable energy and alternative fuels. He has long been dedicated to environmental causes and is now focusing on fabrics. He works to make sure Viper Black "walks their talk" by reducing waste, using only sustainable fabrics and the lowest impact dyes and inks.

Viper Black is for those that want their clothing and their purchase to have meaning: authentic artwork and design, produced locally with environmental consciousness.
